Treasurers Report

The Tasmanian Art Teachers Association Inc. (TATA)

Treasurer's Report for AGM

Reporting Period 8th November 2018 to 17th of November 2019

Balance of TATA Accounts - 08/11/2018 to 17/11/2019

The balance of the TATA MyState Bank Account at the start of the reporting period was \$6522. The balance of the PayPal account at the start of the reporting period was \$872.

Total balance at the beginning of the reporting period was \$7394

Income for TATA - 08/11/2018 to 17/11/2019

TATA's income into the TATA MyState Bank Account for the duration of the reporting period was \$1648.

This included:

- \$1301 from memberships, and
- \$347 from other Stripe sources

The income into TATA's PayPal account over the reporting period was \$72.

All membership transactions that come in via the Website Form have now moved to Stripe. These payments are deposited directly into the TATA MyState bank account. There was also a \$800 transfer from the PayPal to the MyState Bank Account on the 22nd of May 2019, with the aim of consolidating most of the balance into the main account.

Total income for the reporting period was \$1648.

Expenses for TATA - 08/11/2018 to 17/11/2019

The operating costs and expenses for TATA over the reporting period were \$1293. The comprised of:

- Cheque Payment to Department of Justice of \$63 for the annual registration of the association
- Website related expenses incurred \$880
- Insurance for the TATA was also paid to the amount of \$280

Total Expenses for the reporting period was \$1293.

Current Balance of TATA Accounts





As of the 17^{th} of November 2019, the current balance of the TATA MyState Bank Account is \$7658. The balance of the PayPal account is \$72.

There is no petty cash held by the TATA Treasurer for day-to-day purposes.

Total current balance of TATA's accounts is \$7730.

It is a valuable planning resource. The extension of the travel grants to increase engagement if schools in the surrounding area supported more children to see the exhibition.

On Albatross Island

In 2014 Richard Wastell and Matthew Newton, two of Tasmania's leading young artists, accompanied a team of scientists lead by Dr Rachael Alderman on expeditions to remote Albatross Island, Bass Strait, home to over 5000 breeding pairs of Tasmania's endemic Shy Albatross.

On Albatross Island showcases Richard and Matthews' individual artistic responses to this unique environment, while speaking to the important scientific based conservation work being done there. As a result a significant exhibition of paintings, drawings, photographs and video works of a unique and distinctly Tasmanian environment, its life-forms, and its evolving human history were created.

Abbey MacDonald and Carmel Dilger were instrumental in working with the artists to secure an education kit that is housed on the TATA website for members only.
